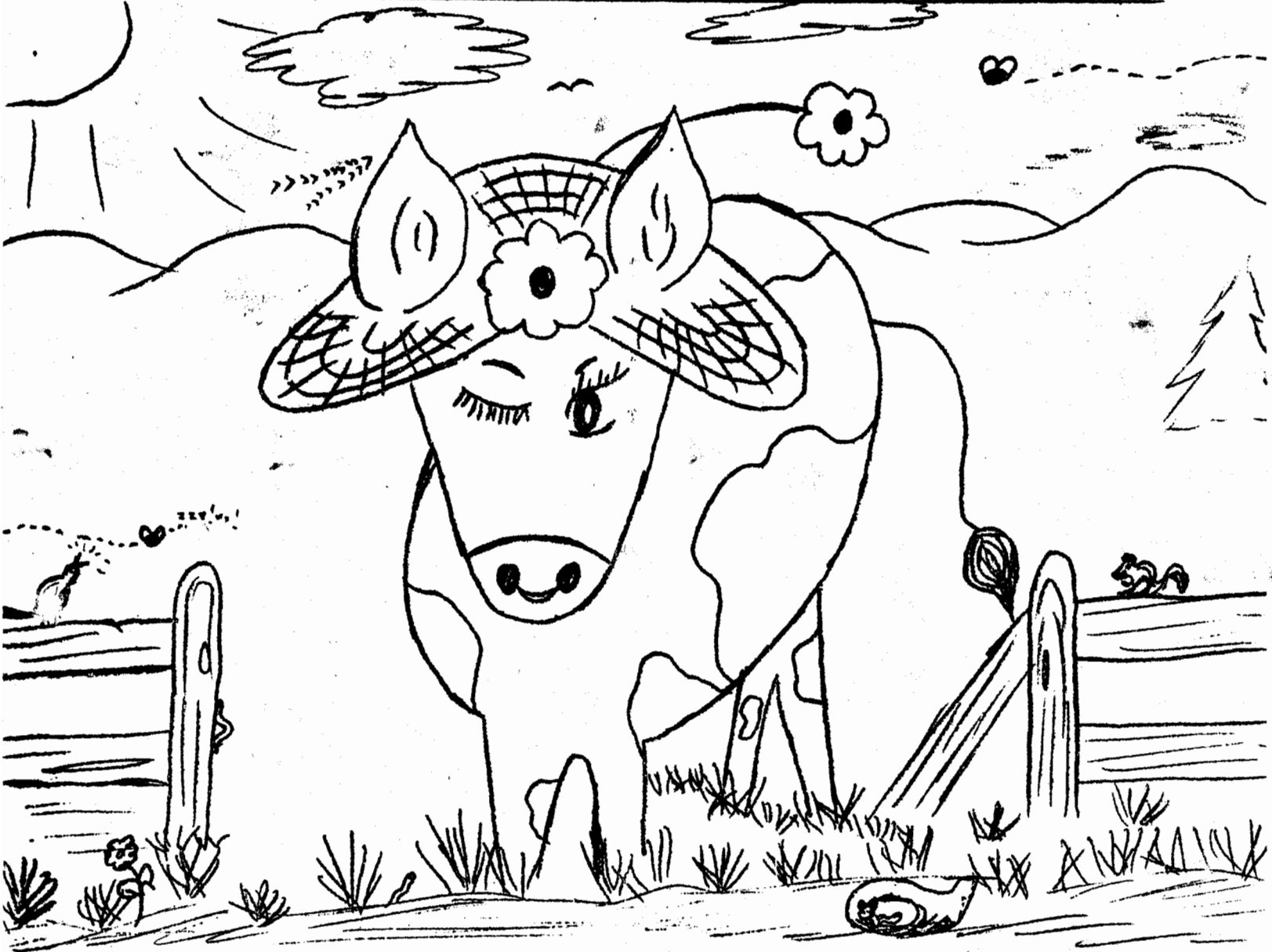

INTERVIEWS

Kathleen Margaret Mayer: This musical beaver was born at the Catherine Booth Hospital on June 8th, 1952. The Mayer side of the Family is German (a distantly related cousin owns the Oscar Meyer Weiner Company) while her mother's parents are Scottish and Canadian. Kathy has a brother, Theo, who is almost 19, and a large black dog named Prince. 4.

Until October 23, 1967, Kathy lived in Notre Dame de Grace. She remembers "gashing" her ear on a toy fire engine and fighting with her brother in the bathtub, when she was little. Kathy attended Nursery School at St. Philip's Church, Somerled Elementary and Monkland High School. At the latter, Kathy had the distinction of being sole Flautist of the school band, and being permitted to join the senior band while only in grade 9. This band was performing in Pittsburg at the time of Martin Luther's assassination. Kathy was also in the school choir for two years. She is now a student of McGill University.

Kathy hopes to teach Elementary school as she loves working with young children. She hopes the teaching would also involve music. Kathy plans to tour Canada coast to coast by car, someday.

Kathy's interests include music, sewing (she makes almost all of her own clothes, and clown costumes too!) and getting to know people. Kathy loves talking with people and having parties. She also likes the outdoors, and camping trips - anything to get out of the city.

When the Hear and Now was just beginning, a friend told Kathy of the group, and she has been a hard-working member ever since. Her favorite songs are, "This New Land", "So Claimon", (although we could do more with it), "Pass it On", "I Believe in Music", "Simple Song of Freedom" - in fact most of them, with the exception of "Reach Out and Touch". Her favorites of the performances are those in which the audience really responds to the music. Kathy believes that our purpose is to provide an hour of song, and not an hour of unorganized talking, and joking around, and that we could be more professional during performances. Kathy wishes there were less emphasis placed on exactness during the meetings and that everyone would take more interest in the newer members.

Purpose: to organize the anniversary party.

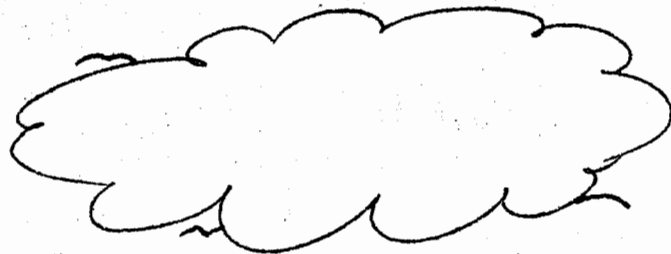
