The idea of having a crest began last Febuary, where many ideas and designs were shown on display at our First Anniversary Banquet. When the group voted for the choosing of one crest, no majority could agree on any specific design.

Therefore in late August the Crest Committee held three meetings. At the first meeting they listened to a "Hear and Now" tape while drinking tea. A lot was accomplished! The second was spent searching through encyclopedia after encyclopedia for a symbol, the result, piles and piles of crumpled paper. Then, a breakthrough! 
